PARCC Assessments

Students in grades 6-8 will begin taking the PARCC the week of May 7th, and grades 3-5 the week of May 14th. In addition, students in grades 5 and 8 will be taking New Jersey's new science assessment on May 23 - 24. If you recall, PARCC replaced the NJASK as the state-required assessment for language arts and math in New Jersey, and is based on the New Jersey Learning Standards for mathematics and ELA.

Last year our students showed themselves to be well-prepared and comfortable taking the test. We have been working hard in River Vale to strike a balance between preparing for the PARCC, while still providing students the rich, comprehensive education they deserve. Ultimately, we pay attention to what we value and regardless of which standardized test the state chooses to use, our *Portrait of a Graduate* needs to be the "north star" by which we define good teaching and learning. Your building principal will continue to keep you updated on building-specific details regarding the PARCC.
